

Mousetrap Cars Maker Challenge Comes to Tamworth ~ Cook Memorial Library will hold a 5-week afterschool maker program for children in grades 4, 5, and 6 on Tuesday afternoons from 3:45 to 5:00 p.m., beginning March 7 and running through April 4. Following a curriculum developed by Claes Thelemarck of Carroll County Cooperative Extension/4-H, young engineers will design and build their own mousetrap powered cars. Once their cars are built, they will experiment by making changes and then testing to see how well their design modifications work to make the cars roll faster and farther. All participants will have an opportunity to race their cars at the 4-H Mousetrap Car Challenge on April 8 at the Meredith Community Center to see how it measures up against the cars of other young engineers.
